Family Promise

As part of a nationwide consortium of churches, Wasatch Presbyterian Church participates in Family Promise (FP), providing a week of no-cost housing and meals to homeless families four times each year.

“Family” is defined as at least one adult with at least one dependent child. Four families are housed, one each in the four Sunday School rooms, on the church’s main level. Breakfast and dinner are prepared and served by Wasatch members in the kitchen and sack lunches are given to all guests.



FP Adults are required to have a job or to be actively looking and, therefore, have a chance to save money for a down payment or rent for a house. Families may stay in FP for up to two years and the success rate (moving into independent housing) is very high.

Wasatch will be hosting again November 13-20. Many people are needed 24/7 to make this “happen.” Please sign up on-line or in Fellowship Hall.

The Family Promise National Convention will be held in Salt Lake September 23-25. WPC members have been asked to help staff the conference. Please contact David Harris at 801-485-1809 to volunteer.

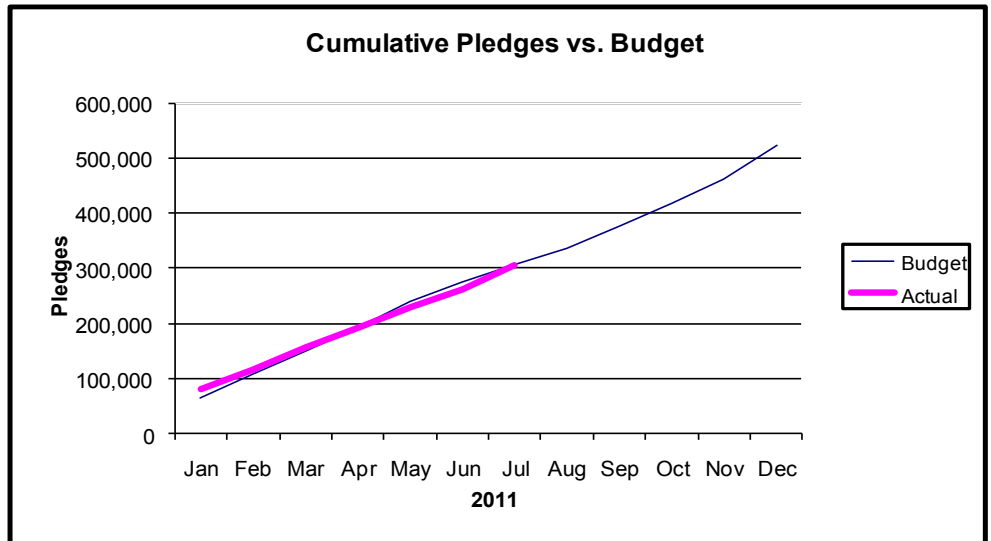

Peace Making Offering

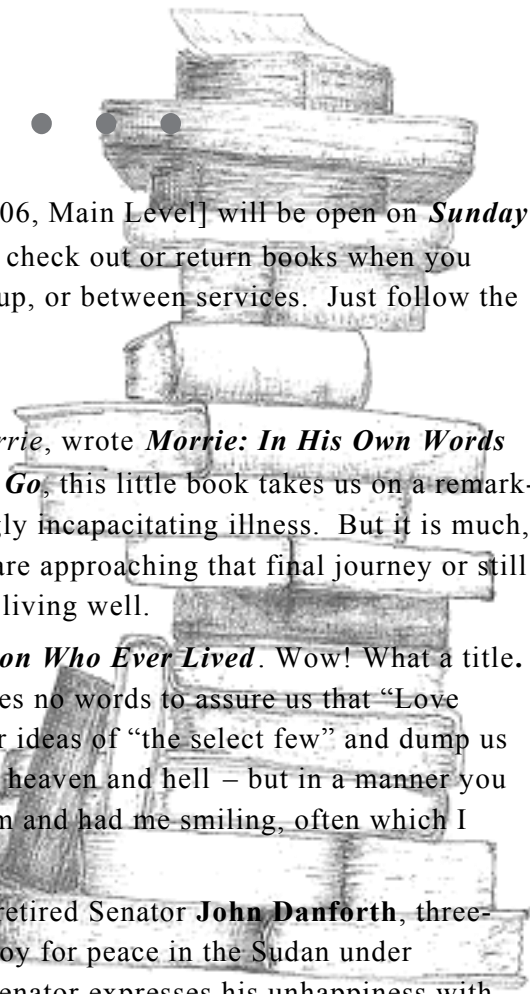

Library Book Notes . . .

Books, new and old—this month’s recommendations:

Morrie Schwartz, the subject of Michael Albom’s *Tuesdays with Morrie*, wrote ***Morrie: In His Own Words*** before his death of Lou Gehrig’s disease. Originally published as ***Letting Go***, this little book takes us on a remarkable journey with a man coming to terms with an incurable and increasingly incapacitating illness. But it is much, much more. This is a guide filled with wisdom for all of us, whether we are approaching that final journey or still at an exciting transfer point, because it’s really a book about living—and living well.

Love Wins: A Book about Heaven, Hell, and the Fate of Every Person Who Ever Lived. Wow! What a title. **Rob Bell** takes us on a fast paced, passionate, potent little book that minces no words to assure us that “Love Wins” – God’s love that is. He sets up lovely little syllogisms that shatter ideas of “the select few” and dump us right into the deepest questions of human suffering, salvation, judgement, heaven and hell – but in a manner you may not have heard before. This book is provocative, but amazingly warm and had me smiling, often which I think tells us a lot about God and heaven!

In a very different vein but worth a read, try: ***Faith and Politics***, by retired Senator **John Danforth**, three-term Republican senator for Missouri, ambassador to the UN, lawyer, envoy for peace in the Sudan under George W. Bush , and ordained Episcopalian minister. In this book, the senator expresses his unhappiness with the growing influence of Christian conservatives in our political system and the polarization in Congress, which has led him—now that he’s retired—to a critical view of some aspects of the current form of republicanism. I noticed throughout the book, that Senator Danforth adjusted his views on issues only after a personal encounter with the issue. You will probably not agree with everything he says, but one important point remains in his book. Change doesn’t seem to happen without engaging with and reaching for understanding with the “real” human being on the “other side.”

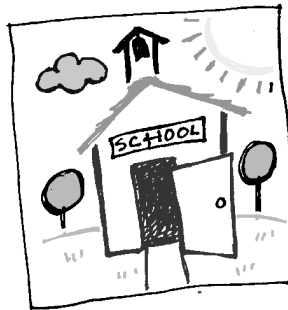
Presbyterian Men of Wasatch

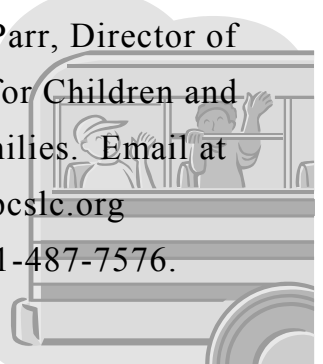

SUNDAY CLASSES, FALL I SERIES: SEPTEMBER 18 — OCTOBER 23.

Both Sunday classes will run for five weeks, 10:00 am to 10:50 am. (No class Sunday October 9)



★*The Origins of Satan:* led by Rev. Scott Wipperman in the Loft--Room 355

John 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. John 1:2 He was with God In the beginning. But, what about Satan? When did he/she/it show up? And where, or from where? In this course we will review how our concept of Satan, the Overlord of the Underworld, developed over the millennia. And how does this history help with our understanding of Satan, the "Soul Merchant," the "Dark Side," the "Devil" today in our post-modern era.

★*Post Traumatic Stress Disorder—What is it? Can We Help?* Led by Tom Mullin, Ph. D. in Room 116

Over the past decade, there has been an explosion of news stories about PTSD, especially as it relates to combat or military service. Despite the greater awareness, many find it difficult to conceptualize what PTSD actually is and how it impacts people, friends, and family. This five part class will address the impact of PTSD, how family members can respond, treatment, and relationship with spirituality. There will be discussion-based elements throughout led by Tom Mullin, a psychologist from the PTSD Clinic at the Salt Lake City VA Hospital.

WEEK DAY ADULT EDUCATION CLASSES: BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 19.

Check the dates and times in each course description below for our study opportunities that are offered during the week.

★*Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study:* Russell Weeks will facilitate this class.

[Disciple I] will meet Thursday evenings, 7:00 pm - 9:30 pm, beginning September 22 and running for 34 weeks over the 2011-2012 year.

★*Into the Word Into the World:* Paul Hewitt will facilitate this class.

[Disciple II] will meet Monday mornings, 9:00 am -11:00 am, beginning September 19 and running 34 weeks over the 2011-2012 year.

★*Reading the Bible In Its Own Terms, a "guided tour of the Bible"* led by Rev. Scott Dalgarno

Will be split into two sessions: one will run Monday evenings from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm; one will run Wednesday mornings, 9:45 am to 11:00 am. Both will run for about 17 weeks, through January 2011. Steven Travis' book, *The Bible In Time* is the cornerstone of the study. Each day participants will read a small section of scripture and a short commentary of the day's text as preparation for the once a week class.

Disciple classes are designed to give participants a thorough overview of the Old and New Testament with daily preparation on the part of participants who commit to the 34 week courses. A sign up table will be in the Fellowship Hall after services on Sundays until September 18.

Reading the Bible in its Own Terms is a course with a shorter commitment of about 18 weeks, designed for people who want an introduction to the basic themes of biblical faith and wish to have a better sense of how the Bible fits together as a whole. A copy of *The Bible in Time* is in the Library.
