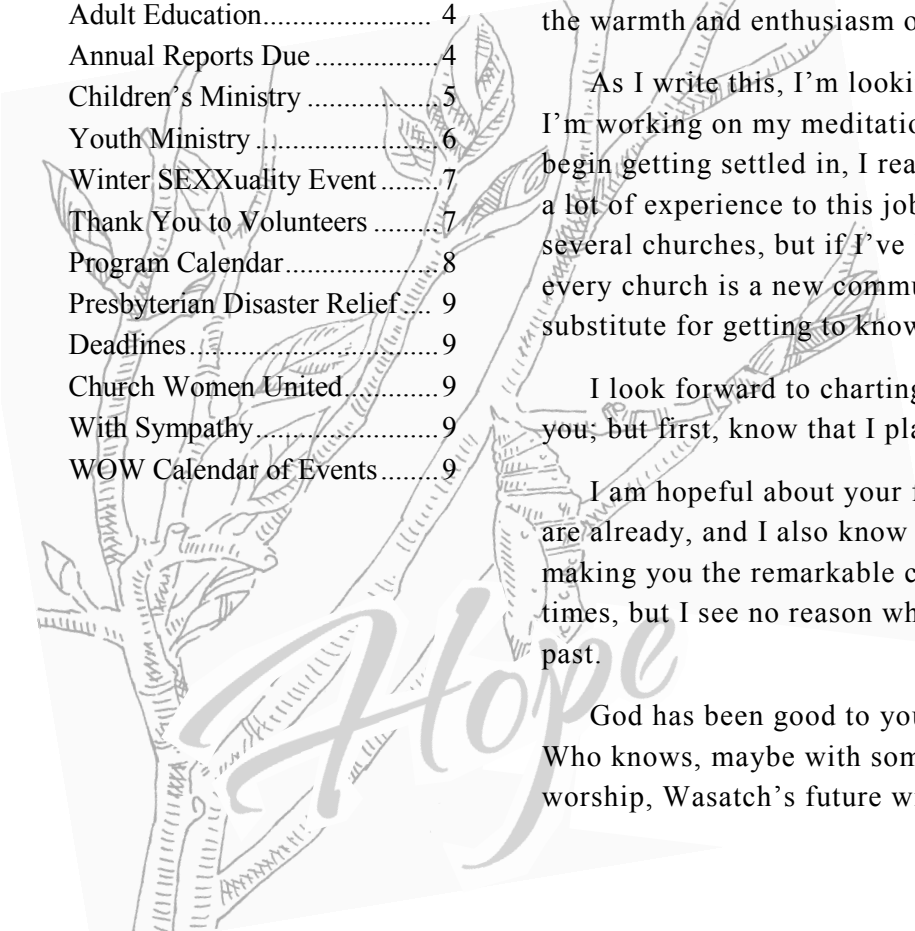

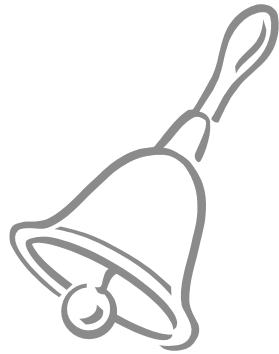
Faith calls us to that which is not known, that which is not sure. As Paul spoke to those in Corinth, "For we walk by faith, not by sight."

It All Adds Up, or Not

But for the nail in the shoe of the horse of the messenger with the report for the general, the battle opportunity was missed, and the war was lost. Little things can add up.

But for the stamps on the envelopes with the pledge cards of about forty members and friends of Wasatch who haven't been heard from yet, opportunities for us to thrive in 2011 are being lost. Individual things are adding up.

Based on current pledges, the Session has reluctantly had to freeze the 2011 budget for all programs and positions at 2010 levels. Also, the session has agonizingly had to state a 36% reduction in compensation for our Associate Pastor position and a 50% reduction for the i believe Music Director. This will begin on April 1. Other potential cuts have been identified for consideration after April 1, depending on how much of our 2010 pledges are paid by year end and whether some fairly ambitious forecast for 2011 pledges are realized.

Don't get me wrong. Wasatch is solid, and it is strongly led by its clergy and Session. It has the strength both to make and to survive difficult budget decisions. But it all has to add up. If you have not yet spoken up about your 2011 pledge, please do so now, before more opportunities pass us up.

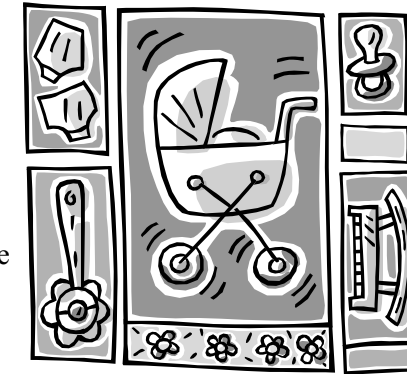

Explanation of Finances

The trend in giving from October to November, both in Pledges and Loose Offering, was downward. This leaves Wasatch Presbyterian Church in a position of having our income being less than our expenses. December's results are not available as of the printing date, but we do know that many people have completed their pledges this month and this is greatly appreciated. If you have not completed your 2010 pledge, we ask that you do so. Any deficit from 2010 is added to 2011's budgeted expenses, only exacerbating the challenges already being addressed in that budget.

Library Book Notes . . .

The Book Nook

What's new in the Library?

Diarmid MacCulloch's *“Christianity: The First Three Thousand Years.”* Yes, that's right; three thousand, not two thousand. Where did Christianity begin? In Athens? In Rome? In Jerusalem? This is where award winning MacCulloch places the extra thousand years, and establishes the framework for his history, the conflict-ing belief systems of Jerusalem and Athens that shaped Christian theology. Through the next two millennia, this monumental but lively work ranges over the three main divisions of Christianity then follows the story into Africa and Asia, traces the Great Awakening in America, Christianity's role in 19th century colonialism, the 20th century World Wars, apartheid in Africa, Christianity's success in Korea and failure in India and much else. Read it all, or read it in part; but read it.

Tuesdays with Morrie: an Old Man, a Young Man, and Life's Greatest Lesson, by Mitch Albom. A true story, deceptively and simply told of the love between a spiritual mentor and his pupil. Albom introduces us to Morrie Schwartz, a one of a kind professor, whom he describes as half Biblical prophet and half Christmas elf. The writer reconnects with him only in the last weeks of Morrie's terminal illness and allows us the privilege of sharing those last intimate meetings. Albom, an acclaimed sports writer, tells this universally touching story with grace and humility, in the process teaching us a great deal about living.

ADULT EDUCATION:

WINTER I CLASSES begin Sunday, January 9: classes run from 10:10 am to 11:00 am.

- **"The Case for Creation"** Led by Robert Dow.
"Does scientific evidence point toward or away from a supernatural Creator? View and discuss a multi-part video featuring interviews with scientists and scholars from a wide range of disciplines."
- **"Healing Family Rifts"** led by Jill James, CSW and Clare Coonan, LCSW
Family rifts happen when one or more members of a family make a conscious decision to "cutoff" another member of the family, meaning they no longer have contact with that person. It is incredibly painful and unfortunately, more common than we realize. Unlike divorce or death, family rifts are often mired in secrecy. Many who experience family rifts are frequently unable to access the healing power of loving relationships because the "cutoff" is so shame filled. Common causes of family rifts include: divorce, marriage outside your race or religion, emotional abuse, or objections to sexual orientation and addictions. There are simple steps you can practice to begin the healing process for you and your family. Whether you have experienced a "cutoff" from a family member, or you have "cutoff" a family member due to intolerable behavior, this class can help you stay centered in your healing process and offer hope to other members of your family. This course will create a safe space to talk about your family experience and helpful hints on how to respond with love and compassion, both for yourself and the other family members involved.

SPECIAL JANUARY ADULT EDUCATION/YOUTH CLASS

Sunday, January 16: "Amendment 10 A & the Presbyterian Constitution" led by Lisa Larges, Master of Divinity. Class will meet at 10:10 am in the Loft.

Our Presbytery will vote on Amendment 10 A in the spring. This class will provide an opportunity for our congregation to talk about the amendment with Lisa Larges, Minister Coordinator of "That All May Freely Serve." Regular adult and youth education classes will be suspended on this Sunday so that all will have the opportunity to hear Lisa's presentation and engage in dialogue with her.

Amendment 10-A

Standards for ordained service reflect the church's desire to submit joyfully to the Lordship of Jesus Christ in all aspects of life (G-1.0000). The governing body responsible for ordination and/or installation (G-14.0240; G-14.0450) shall examine each candidate's calling, gifts, preparation, and suitability for the responsibilities of office. The examination shall include, but not be limited to, a determination of the candidate's ability and commitment to fulfill all requirements as expressed in the constitutional questions for ordination and installation (W-4.4003). Governing bodies shall be guided by Scripture and the confessions in applying standards to individual candidates.

This amendment is the proposed replacement for Book of Order section G-6.0106b, which, since 1996, has been used to discourage gay and lesbian believers from consideration for ordination. A copy of the current *Book of Order, Part II* is available in the church library for anyone who would like to review the current section.

This forum grew out of an Adult Education class led this fall by Ashtora Fitzsimmons called *Anyone and Everyone, Everything you wanted to know about Homosexuality, but were afraid to ask.* The class used Mt. Kisco, New York's Presbyterian Church's Blue Book and Iron Zeal's DVD, *Anyone and Everyone*, as resource materials. Participants learned about and discussed sexuality and orientation from biblical, theological, social, scientific, and biological perspectives. The class went so well that Adult Education felt a need to bring this discussion to a larger audience and decided to sponsor the *Winter SEXXuality Event*, a public forum in Salt Lake City, led by Lisa Larges and Will McGarvey.

He has been active in youth ministry and many justice-seeking endeavors, including TAMFS.

We encourage youth and their Parents to attend this conversation together. Youth Ministry will not be supervising youth during this hour. We hope you and your young people will make plans to attend this event together.

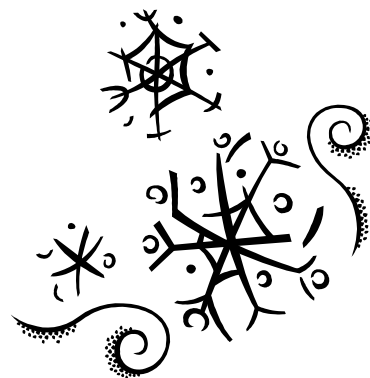
