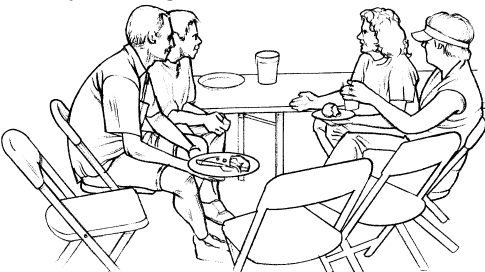
## Salt Shakers Sign Up

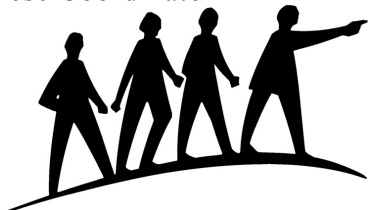
## Sudanese Fellowship NEWS

The people of Southern Sudan overwhelmingly approved the referendum for independence in January. It was conducted largely without conflict, with broad participation of the people in Sudan and in the USA. Philip Leko, one of our newest members and a leader in the Sudanese Fellowship, traveled to Seattle, Washington to cast his vote. We rejoice with them for this accomplishment and continue to pray for the peaceful and just formation of the new government.

William Samuel was born three months early on October 31, 2010 and came home to father, Stephen Mouke and mother, Rebecca Weda the first part of February. On February 13, Pastor Scott Dalgarno blessed little William in the 2:00 pm service, and Janet Wortley presented a gift basket to the family from the Presbyterian Women. 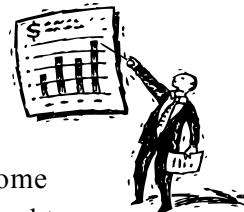

### What Do All These Numbers Mean?

Every year we estimate how much income we will receive each month. Then the Session determines how much we can spend each month based on the careful income estimate. This month we have more income than we thought we would. This is because some people pay their whole pledge in January. The carryover amount (\$12,087) is extra income we did not spend from 2010. ### Reception for Mary Lou McCaa

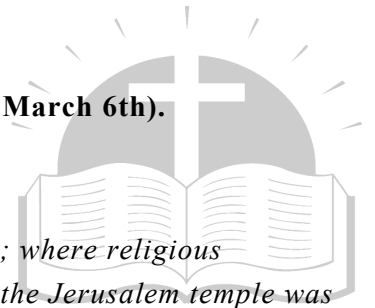

## ADULT EDUCATION:

WINTER II CLASSES—5 weeks, starting Sunday, February 27 - April 3 (no class March 6th).

Classes run from 10:10 am to 11:00 am.

- **"The Missing Years: from Malachi to Matthew"** led by Beth Phillips  
*Jesus lived in a world where synagogues offered prayer, worship and education; where religious discussions centered on ideas such as angels, Satan and life after death; where the Jerusalem temple was the focus for a global community, attracting Jews from all over the Mediterranean world; where a people, now called Jews, comprised diverse—and deeply divided—religious communities of Pharisees, Sadducees and Essenes, among many others. None of this was present in the 5<sup>th</sup> century BCE when Israelite temple worship was restored in post-exilic Jerusalem and when Malachi wrote. What happened during the five centuries between the Old and the New Testament and why are there no books about it in the Bible? The class looks at this time of radical change in the light of archaeology, history and the extra-Biblical books of the time.*
- **"The Beauty and Courage of Sudan: Why a Dream of Peace is Possible"** led by Anita Rigstad  
*The class will familiarize participants with the people and the land of Sudan, and with the politics of war and peace. The emphasis, however will be on the Sudanese's own dream of peace and the Church's moral authority to work with them to that end. Given the elections now taking place in Sudan, this class will be especially timely. Bring your questions.*



## Library Book Notes . . .



Ash Wednesday, March 9, opens the Lenten season. If you choose to “take on” instead of “giving up” for this time, you might want to take a look at a little 4x6 book in the library called ***Living in Lent: Meditations for these Forty Days*** By Barbara Cawthorn Crafton, an Episcopal priest currently serving as rector of St. Clement’s Church in Manhattan. The book holds a collection of short daily meditations based on the seasonal hymns of her church, well designed for personal reflection during Lent. Or try ***Martin Buber’s 10 Rungs: Collected Hasidic Sayings***, a completely different tune to be sure, but thought provoking and at the same time; many of the sayings will make you smile.

***The Gospel According to Paul***, by Robin Griffith-Jones; “This is the most helpful book on Paul I have ever read. I am deeply indebted to its author,” so remarks Huston Smith, author of *The World’s Religions*. And I would agree! In addition to a comfortable writing style, Griffith-Jones takes time to introduce us to the kind of questions Paul himself was dealing with before moving us into modern ideas, making this book readable and enjoyable for lay reader and academic alike. Visit with Paul at the stopping places on his travels, see what he was up against, and do so guided by a fine writer and scholar. You’ll gain a deeper appreciation for this “creative genius who brought Jesus to the world.”

Barbara Kingsolver’s ***Another America/Otra America*** is not an easy read — but the poetry is superb. The topics are tough to hear and tough to feel, but Kingslover can move you as only good poetry can. I wish I knew Spanish since each poem in English is faced with the same in Spanish. I have a feeling the Spanish may say more than English is capable of. I’ll have a copy on my own shelf soon as this is a book that improves with age – mine as well as the book’s.

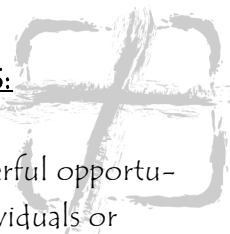

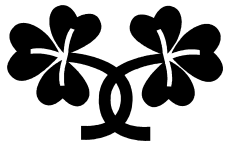
