A TIME TO BE SILENT, *AND A TIME TO SPEAK UP*

On Wednesday, April 13, at our Steering Committee meeting, I brought up the subject of the recent burning of a copy of the Muslim *Qur'an* by Terry Jones, a Florida pastor. I'm sure you will remember that he had previously threatened to burn one on the anniversary of 9/11 last September, but was talked out of it by a number of public figures.

Last week, after a bizarre mock-trial of the Muslim scriptures (that lasted eight minutes) Pastor Jones decreed that the *Qur'an* perpetrated violence and he ordered the book to be burned. The fallout in the Arab world has been horrendous, leading to the deaths of a number of innocent U.N. workers.

It seemed to me that such an act by a Christian church requires that at least some Christians stand up and address the tragedy perpetrated by these wrong-headed members of our faith.

Why us? While most Christians are ignoring the act as the work of the lunatic fringe, I believe that Presbyterians have a moral obligation to do something about it. What makes us unique among Christians is our belief that God alone is Lord of the conscience, and that the human conscience performs best when informed by education. This is because people tend to get "down" on what they are not "up" on. It is also true that to remain silent before unspeakable things is, in a way, to be complicit in them.

I proposed at Wednesday's meeting that we partner with our neighbor, *The King's English Bookstore*, and buy a number of copies of the *Qur'an* which will be given away one-at-a-time free of charge by the bookstore to those who ask for them. If members of Pastor Jones church follow their consciences and burn the *Qur'an*, we, the leaders of Wasatch Presbyterian, should follow the dictates of our own consciences and do something to assuage the violence that spun off from that act so people in Salt Lake City and elsewhere might see that not all Christians see other religions (particularly Islam) as our enemies. I offered the first \$100 toward this purchase myself.

Steering Committee agreed this was a good idea and within 24 hours I had collected enough money to buy between 50 and 60 *Qur'ans*. Ann Holman,

manager of King’s English, was more than happy to partner with us and an Oxford edition of the Qur’an was chosen. Books might be available for the give-away as early as Easter Monday.

Amy Kim and Justin Kyremes-Parks designed a bookmark to be given away with each book that reads . . .

This Qur’an has been donated by the leaders of Wasatch Presbyterian Church who are not afraid of truth no matter where it can be found.

In answer to the denigration of the Muslim scriptures, which led to tragic deaths of a number of innocents, we are providing copies of the Qur’an to people and we are saying, “Take a look at this book for yourself and see what you think.”

I am writing this on the eve of Good Friday, the day that commemorates the execution of the one who was killed in part because he dared to say, “Blessed are the peacemakers.” It is my hope that this small stand, taken by our leadership, might do it’s part to honor Him.

Family Promise

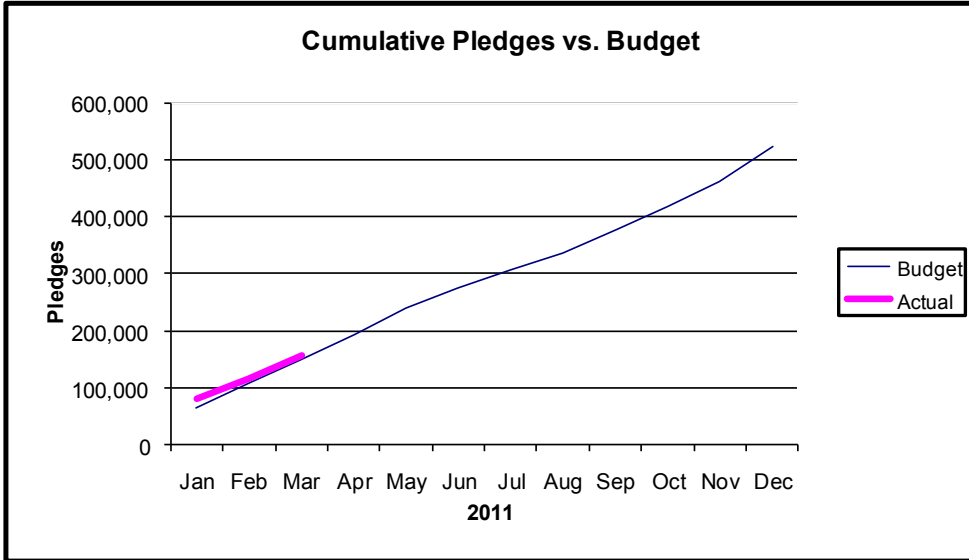

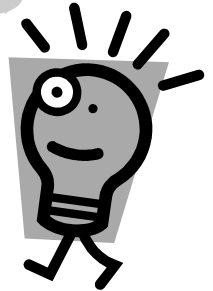

Looking Ahead:

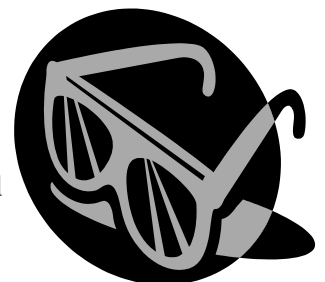
